Always do what is *right*.



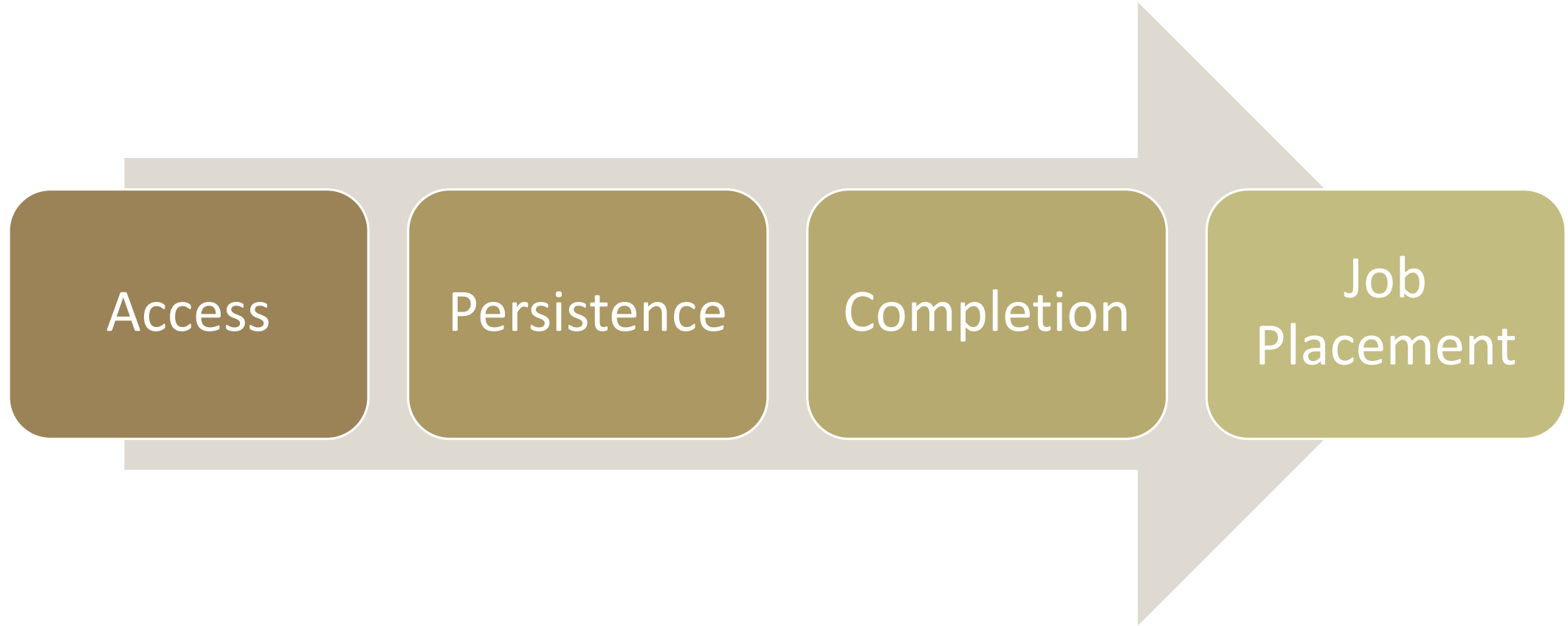
Our Mission

All Participants must meet certain requirements in order to enroll in the program:

- ✓ US Citizen or Legal Resident & live in the County of El Paso
- ✓ Below 200% of the HHS Poverty Guidelines
- ✓ Be 18 years of age or older
- ✓ Eligible to work in the U.S.

- You want economic success and to **secure your families future**

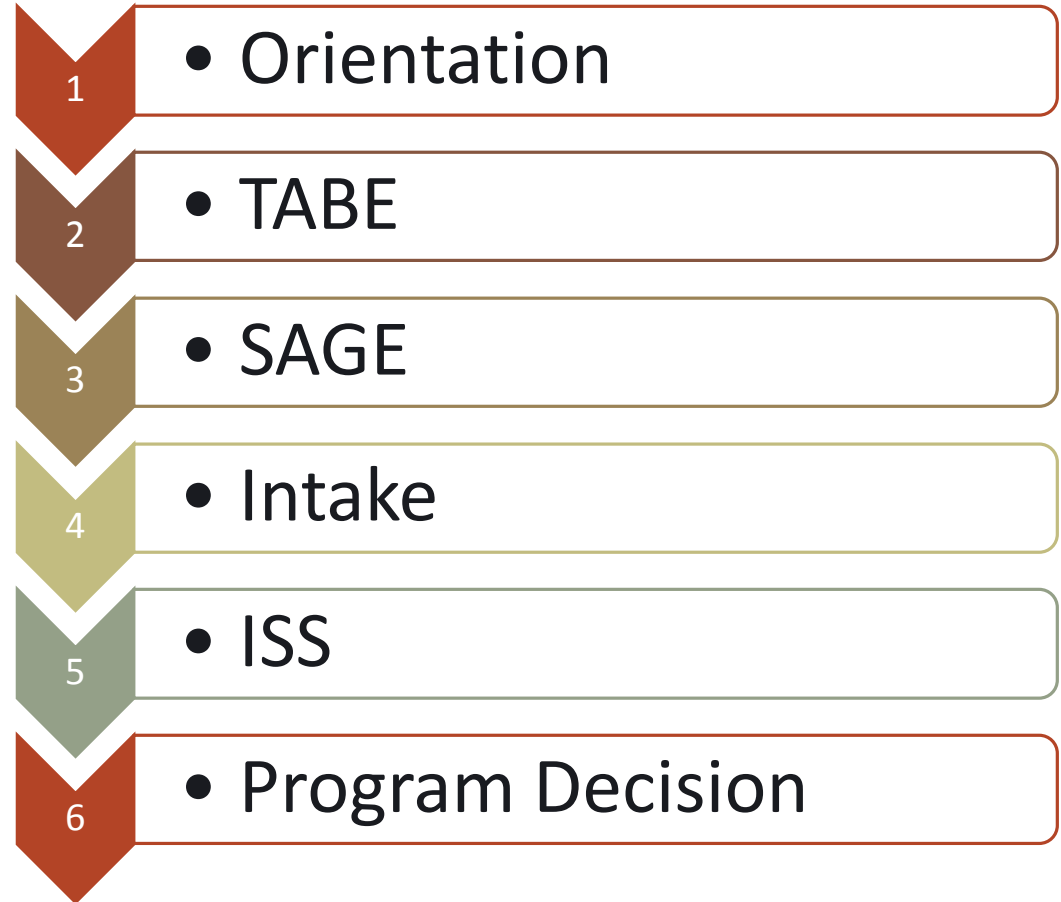


Application Process
